Following our second public meeting in the Town of Peshtigo on January 23, we followed up by mail with a survey form asking if and how you would like us to communicate with you. For those of you who returned that survey, thank you very much. We were very encouraged by the fact that we've received responses from over 100 households: clearly many in the community want to keep informed about this issue.

For those who have not yet had the time to return the survey, we would still like to hear from you. Please feel free to reach out to us—our contact information is at the bottom of this page—and let us know how you prefer to hear from us: U.S. Postal Service; email (please provide your email); regular public meetings; postings on our website; or by you calling us at the 800 number below.

And as we have said consistently, we are committed to keeping you informed. We will communicate in a regular fashion with you [by letter/by email] as you've asked us to. And we'll send updates each time anything significant occurs.

The most important issue to update you about is that we were required to submit a Site Investigation Work Plan and a Long Term Potable Well Monitoring Plan to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) by March 12. We're pleased to let you know that we completed these proposed work plans and have submitted them to the DNR. The proposed Site Investigation Work Plan describes the further investigation of groundwater, soil, storm water and ditch sampling in the area. The Long Term Potable Well Monitoring Plan lays out a schedule to re-sample all potable (drinking water) wells that we've tested in the area. This work will begin as soon as this spring.

Once at the above web address, enter *02-38-580694* into the *Activity Number* box and press *Search*. You will be able to download copies of the work plans to read and fully understand the proposed upcoming work. This is an important milestone in our investigation and we wanted to let you know that we've worked very hard to create these plans to continue to address this issue.

Finally, you should also know that we speak and share information regularly with the DNR, and provide updates, as appropriate, to the Town of Peshtigo and City of Marinette. We're committed to partnering and working in cooperation with the appropriate regulatory agencies and elected officials.
